This month my article is about the duties of the Squadron Treasurer and the committees this officer is responsible for. As you read this article, try and decide if you would like to help on any of these committees.



The Treasurer is an elected position, and carries the rank of Lieutenant Commander.

Section 6.6 of our squadron bylaws states: "The Treasurer shall:

- Collect and hold, in the name of this squadron, all funds belonging to this squadron.
- Pay all bills contracted by this squadron which have been approved by the BOD or by the head of a department or the chairman of a committee which has contracted the same by virtue of appropriations made by the BOD or by the adopted budget.
- (a) Make interim reports, including statements of receipts, disbursements and financial condition, at such times as the commander or the BOD may direct;
- (b) prepare an annual report as of the last day of the squadron's fiscal year; and (c) make all financial records available for the Auditing Committee inspection required by Section 6.10.
- Keep and preserve an accurate record

of all funds received and disbursed and of all squadron property.

- Promptly send funds due USPS from new members to headquarters.
- Pay to the district to which this squadron is assigned any annual assessment, at such time and in such manner as directed by the district.
- Prepare and file in a timely manner all required federal, state and local tax and information returns.
- Perform such other appropriate duties incident to the office as are required by USPS policy, or as the commander or the BOD may direct.
- Be, *ex officio*, a member of all committees in the Treasurer's Department.

The Treasurer can have an Assistant Treasurer who is also elected and has the rank of 1st Lieutenant.

The Treasurer is responsible for the following appointed committees: Ship's Store and Property/House Officer.

This information comes from Palm Beach Sail and Power Squadron Bylaws and roster. Next month's topic will be duties of the Nominating Committee.

The PALM BEACH SAIL & POWER SQUADRON bylaws that were approved by its General Membership on 8 May, 2018, were approved by National on 1 June, 2018. I'm thrilled that we bring together boaters, non-boaters, retired boaters, and "soon-to-be" boaters to support a common cause of "safe boating". As we begin our season, it's a good time for each of us to look at how we can pitch in. There are many areas that would benefit from your valuable support.

From the Educational Officer

LT/C ARTHUR DODD, SN

The Basic Boating class was given as an outreach class to 8 students at Voloridge Investment Management, Inc. This was the first time to my knowledge that we've given the class to a private group at their location. It was decided that we would not offer the Basic Boating class in September. As mentioned last month, we are looking to switch the Basic Boating class from weekends to weeknights. The drive for this is the falloff of attendance for weekend classes vs. attendance at the weeknight classes given at the North Palm Beach Library last year and by other squadrons. So, we have scheduled the classes for 3 weeknights per course; the first will be 16, 17 & 18. October. Classes will run 7 – 9:30pm.

Marine Electrical Systems, with instructor Lt Larry Rudner, SN, started September 13 and will run through November. Piloting, with Lt Mike Galvin, SN, started 24 September and will also run through November.

USPS has announced a new course and a new seminar. This is different from the restructuring of the Seamanship (aka Boat Handling) class and related seminars; it's the first time in a long time a new class has been offered. The class is *Radar for Boat-ers*, developed by our friends up North – the Canadian Power and Sail Squadrons. It contains material for current radar systems and systems that will be available in the near future. The course covers what you need to know about radar, from how and where to mount the antenna to how to interpret the displays. It's recommended that students have completed Marine Navigation (Piloting) and Advanced Marine Navigation (Advanced Piloting) before taking this course. The course is designed for 8 to 10

hours of classroom instruction with exams available for those who want credit. **Any volunteers for teaching this course?**

The seminar is *Propane Systems on Your Boat*. Many boats have a propane system that provides fuel for the galley stove, barbecue, and sometimes hot water. These are highly useful, but very dangerous if precautions aren't taken (quick – is LPG lighter or heavier than air, and why would it matter?*). This seminar discusses the uses and risks of LPG systems, such as safe storage of LPG cylinders, LPG system design, how to turn the system on and off, how to test for leaks (hint – no candles), and what to do if you have a leak. Information from this seminar could save a life. *LPG is heavier than air, so any leaked gas could accumulate in the cabin or bilge and presents an explosion risk, just like gasoline.

I was recently given a brochure about Electric Shock Drowning. This is a result of an improperly installed or improperly maintained or modified electrical system in a marina. The concern involves a break in the ground wire that would result in short circuit current passing through the water around the affected boat. Anyone swimming in the area could be subject to an electric shock from this and, since an electric shock often results in paralysis, they would drown. Recommendations are to never swim in a marina and never modify the boat electrical system to disable the ground connection – **NEVER, EVER, CLIP THE GROUND PRONG ON AN ELECTRICAL PLUG.**

Final reminder: an Instructor Qualification recertification class is scheduled for the Fall District 8 Conference 26 - 28 October. If you are a Certified Instructor with certification that expires this year or next year, you should take advantage of this. Also, you can recertify even if your certification expired a few years ago.

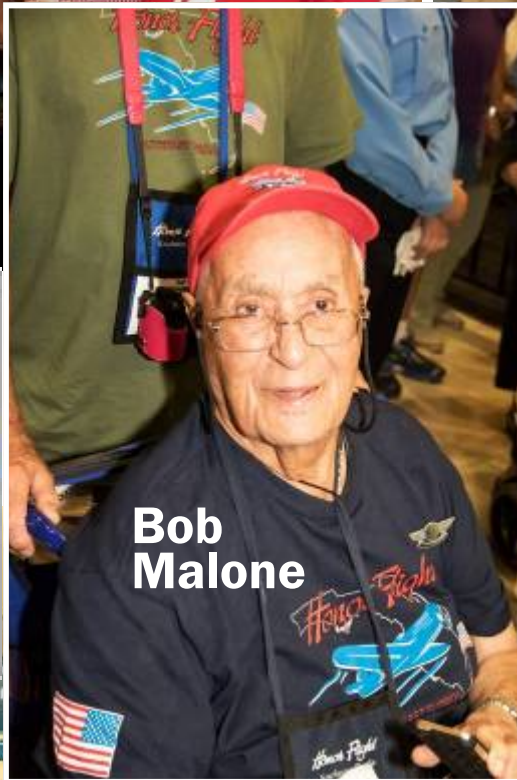

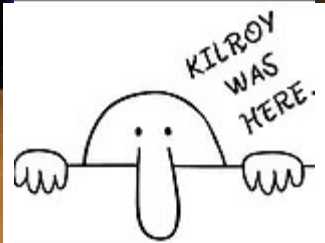

Bobby Soles Propeller & Marine

1962 has evolved as a natural off-shoot of his prowess as a hydroplane racer. Jim grew up in Bonita Springs with four siblings. Recreation was never far removed from boats. His first was acquired at the age of seven. Many more followed through the years. His initial career did not reflect his love for the water. For 24 years he excelled in marketing and sales for the brokerage house, A.G. Edwards until it were bought out by Wachovia, and that is when Jim decided to move on in the hope of finding his niche in the marine world. Now, as President and owner of Bobby Soles Propellers & Marine, his hope has been fulfilled.

Bobby Soles Propellers & Marine has an unmatched reputation as propeller experts in our three-county area. The business is divided into two main parts. 1. The distribution of Michigan Wheel products accounts for most of the sales, 2. the bulk of its revenues come from repairing and reconditioning existing props, plus various types of fabrication.

As you enter the 10,000 sq. ft. shop, you will be immediately impressed by the range of machine tools and the variety of work being performed. You will see props in aluminum, stainless steel, and bronze with diameters ranging from 13" to 61" .



Incoming propellers are scanned by computer in three dimensions to determine exactly what needs to be done to restore correct geometric balance. Repairs are then carried out by a combination of machines and extremely skilled craftsmen. They also make various custom-made frames, supports, and other fabrications destined for customers' working or pleasure boats.

Bobby Soles Propellers & Marine has twelve employees, most of whom have carried over from the previous owner. Watching them work, it's easy to recognize the skills they have acquired during their years with the company. Jim's wife, Allison, is a key employee who also finds time to home-school their son Brandon.

Marinas make up the bulk of Bobby Soles Propellers & Marine's customers. Jim is expanding his direct retail sales. Typically a pleasure boat owner with a damaged propeller goes to his dealer who will probably suggest he buy a new one (more profit) rather than repairing it. If that is you, get a quote from Bobby Soles Propellers & Marine.

Props corrode, abrade, and get damaged at low-tide situations, but 80% of Jim's business is a direct result of an owner's carelessness. "Over exuberance" is his best friend!

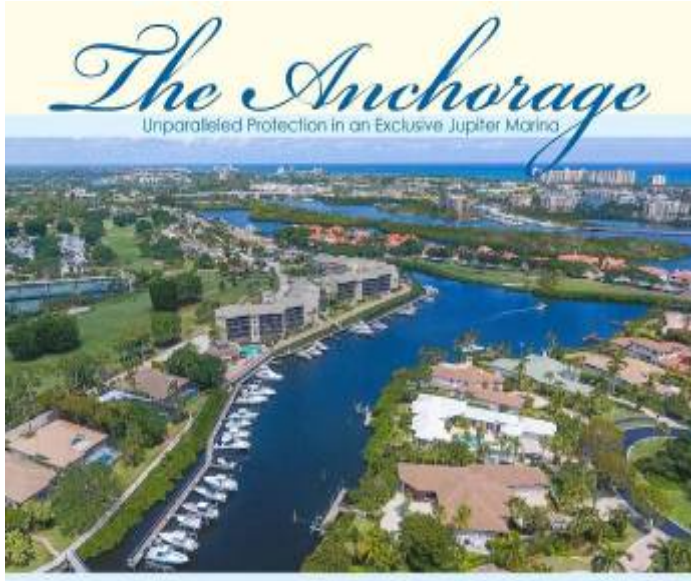
From the Executive Officer
