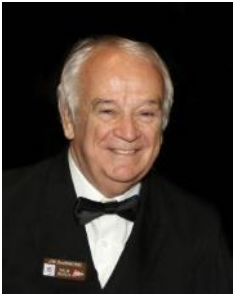

This month I would like to give you information about the districts of the United States Power Squadrons and why they are important and how they help the squadrons.

- There are 32 districts covering the United States, Virgin Islands and Puerto Rico, and Japan.
- Palm Beach Sail and Power Squadron (Americas' Boating Club of Palm Beach) belongs to District 8 (America's Boating Club of Southeast Florida).
- District 8's area covers Southeast Florida from Sebastian to Key West and includes 12 squadrons.
- At this time, the District Commander is our own D/C Ed Hoover, AP
- Districts were and are created by National to geographically associate squadrons in that area or region.
- Their purpose is to inform and assist the local squadrons in the area; to stay abreast of new policies, using new technologies and tools; and to facilitate the sharing of knowledge/experience among the district's squadrons
- Each district has its own bylaws
- The Executive Committee/ (Board Of Directors) of a district is called a Council and does the working business of the district. Voting members of the Council include the Bridge, General Committee Chairs, all Squadron Commanders, and the most recent Past District Commander
- The Conference is similar to a squadron's General Membership Meeting. Delegates from each of the squadrons add to the number of voting members. Delegates are appointed by the squadrons' Commanders who submit their names to the authorized voting delegate.

Educational Special Event

The Boating Skills Virtual Trainer (aka the boat simulator) will be set up at our HQ in late January. Dates will be set for people to come and give it a drive. Look for an announcement for the dates.

Instructor Development

This course is intended to train the trainers (teach the teachers?). It is required by law for instructors teaching a NASBLA-/state-approved basic boating course like ABC3. It is also highly recommended for all instructors. The emphasis is on enhancing presentation techniques and instructor skills. The course has been designed to demon-

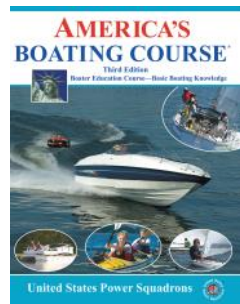
strate interactive teaching methods focused on adult learning. Students are required to prepare lesson plans and give presentations that are graded. This is the only FREE course given by USPS. OpenCPN

What is it and what does it mean to us? OpenCPN is an open-source Chart Plotter Navigation software that can be used while underway or as a planning tool. It is downloaded onto a laptop or pc and is compatible with Windows, Mac OSX and Linux. It is FREE. In addition to the software, you download copies of needed charts. It works with GPS and AIS to give you real-time information with a displayed chart. Did I mention it's FREE? OpenCPN is now part of Piloting and Advanced Piloting; however, there doesn't seem to be a seminar on it for those who want to learn about it without taking Piloting or Advanced Piloting. We are looking to develop and present a seminar on OpenCPN in 2020. Also, OpenCPN is FREE!

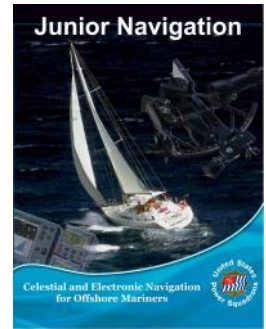
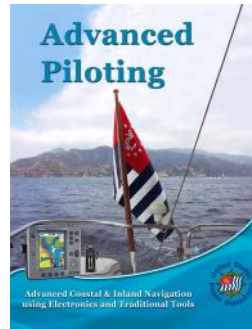
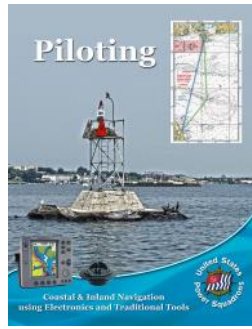
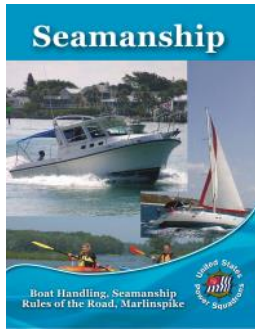
Pop Quiz Answer: Christopher Columbus (a.k.a. Cristobol Colon). Sugar cane is native to Southeast Asia. In 1492, he brought sugar cane seedlings to Hispaniola, where they grew well in the tropical environment. He obtained the seedlings from his father-in-law, who raised sugar cane on the island of Madeira. During his exploration of the Caribbean, he discovered that the Arawak Indians used a support made out of woven bark slung from a couple of supports. He brought this concept back to Spain, where it was adopted for a more compact, and more comfortable, means for sailors to sleep on ships. Before then, sailors would sleep on any convenient surface. "Hammock" is an Arawak word (as are barbecue, canoe, Caribe, cannibal, hurricane, and other commonly used words). Amazing what you can learn on a cruise ship.

Junior Navigation

Wednesdays: Beginning 8 Jan.

Runs for 20 weeks, ending 27 May

Location: Squadron HQ
1125 Old Dixie Hwy, Lake Park

Cost: \$100 (includes student manuals and use of squadron's sextants)

Junior Navigation is the first of a two-part program in Offshore Navigation.

Subject matter includes:

- Basic concept of Celestial Navigation.
- How to use the sextant to take sights on the sun.
- The techniques and importance of accurate time determination.
- Use of the Nautical Almanac.
- How to reduce sights to establish lines of position (LOPs).
- The use of GPS, special charts, plotting sheets and other navigational data for offshore positioning and passage planning.

Course Description: Junior Navigation is designed as a practical, how-to course using GPS for offshore navigation with sun sight taking using a sextant as a backup technique. The more advanced techniques for other celestial bodies and sights are for study in the subsequent Navigation Course.

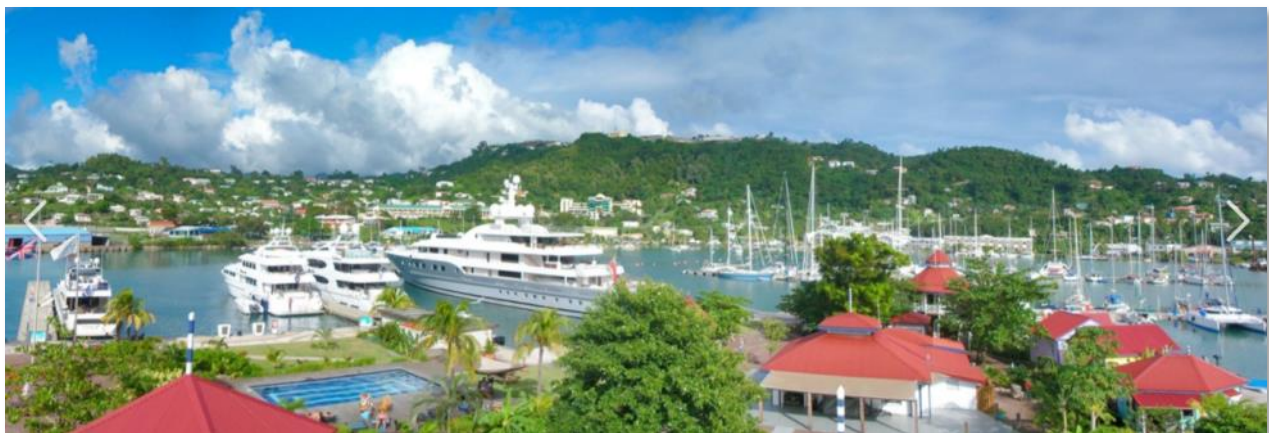
- The penultimate OTW (On-The-Water) Training:

Grenada, a spectacularly beautiful island, has lush green mountains, crystal waterfalls, golden beaches, and the fragrant spice trees that give the island its epithet “Isle of Spice.” Come from late January to early March to get the added bonus of seeing the hills ablaze with hundreds of bright orange, flowering immortelle trees: pure magic.

Grenada’s history has been lively, with early wars and revolutions. More recently, things got exciting with the transition to full independence in 1974. Most Grenadians felt this was premature, and instead of jubilant celebrations, the island was on strike and in protest. Nonetheless, independence was thrust upon her, and Grenada came of age under the rule of Sir Eric Gairy, a flamboyant and controversial figure who had a very divisive effect on the population. This resulted in the 1979 left-wing coup by Maurice Bishop, who greatly admired Fidel Castro. Bishop attempted to turn Grenada into a socialist state. He improved medical care and education, but he did so at the cost of freedom: anyone
