Chasing the *Wild Goose* Elvin E. 'Bud' Greene, III SN

For more than can be accurately remembered, Bud (his professional name) Greene was a Sail Instructor and later, a long-time Chairman of Elective Courses. Equally as long has been Bud's love affair with sailing and the P.B. Sail & Power Squadron. He celebrated this 50th year in 2015, making him the oldest but not by age.

Sailing became a passion when he purchased his first 'boat'. It was a G.P., General Purpose, English kit from Bell Woodworking at the cost of \$2500. The construction took place in his back yard, which thrilled his mother.

Bud Greene is a real local boy. The Greene family which arrived in Lake Worth in 1912, is a real Pioneer Family. He was born in Lake Worth, attended Lake Worth High School in 1950, went to Florida State University, and graduated from the University of Miami. With a degree in Speech Pathology, he became a therapist for the Palm Beach County Schools.

He served as vocal soloist at Fort

Benning, GA, with the 439th Army Band. As a respected actor and soloist, Bud had his own TV show called "The Bud Greene Show." He was also the soloist for Unity of the Palm Beaches for over 30 years.

Bud has been married to Helen Vogt Greene for 53 years. They have a daughter, Lynda Louise Kuperferman, a wonderful son-in-law, Ken, and two amazing 17 year old twin grandchildren, Ashley & Adam, who both skipped their senior year, and are in the dual-enrollment college program. Needless to say, the Greenes are justly proud of all of the Kupfermans. Good things happen in spite of genetics!

Sailing and the call of the *Wild Goose* held a certain magic. (*Wild Goose* was the name of his 35-foot Morgan sloop sailboat.)

Bud shared his love and skills as a certified, licensed, charter boat captain. He is honored to serve and be recognized for his now over 53 years of service. Only physical conditions limit his further service. To all the members..."May fair winds always be at your back."



We were both surprised at the turnout for his talk and all of the cogent questions from the audience.

This is an inexpensive chart-plotter that will run on most Android and Apple cellphones and tablets. With a decent chartplotter starting these days at around \$500 it is great to have something with a cost of only \$15 a year to be able to keep safe on the water. The great thing about the Navionics App once you download the program and maps you will need, there is no need to be connected to a WiFi connection.
