FROM THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT BY SEO P/C Jim Merker, AP

3 RULES OF BASIC BOATING!

With boating season in full swing, it is more important than ever to remember the lessons we learned in our basic safe boating class and Seamanship! I say this from experience, as I broke three of our most basic rules and had to pay the price...



Rule #1: 1/3rds Rule - Fuel usage should be 1/3 out, 1/3 back, and 1/3 for reserve.

Rule #2: Never, but never, rely on your boat's fuel gauge! OK, maybe just a little bit if you have proven it works.

Gail Wall, our Admin Officer, was gracious enough to offer me the opportunity of running up to the District 23 Picnic in Titusville with her by boat. Seeing as I am currently boat-less, and don't think I have made it out on the water since the Christmas Boat Parade, I gladly accepted. Gail was planning to top off the fuel tank on our way out that morning, but the fuel dock didn't open for another 30 minutes, and her fuel gauge showed that there was about 7/8 of a tank, so we decided to make our trek. It was about a 45-mile run from Palm Bay Marina up to Titusville, and we made it in about 2 hours without event.

It turned out to be a beautiful day to be boating and enjoying a great picnic. They have plenty of excellent food, lots of raffle items, and great comradery. We all had a blast. As we were leaving the dock, the fuel level was still above 1/2 full, so we had used roughly 3/8 of a tank. I figure it we should still have plenty of fuel to get back. (Just broke the 1/3 Rule: $3/8 + 3/8 + 3/8 = 1 \text{ \& } 1/8$ tanks of fuel)

We had a fantastic cruise back down to Palm Bay Marine. As we were approaching Dragon Point, Gail and I briefly discussed stopping for fuel, but the fuel gauge said we still had 3/8 of a tank at that point. So, I was pretty comfortable we would make it back without issue. (Broke my second Rule, NEVER trust your fuel gauge!!!)

As I was about to drop off plane, we still had 1/4 tank of fuel. Once the boat settled, the needle dropped to the E, but it wasn't pegged low. Now I got a little nervous, but we only had to go about 1 mile to get to the fuel dock. As we were coming in, Gail was joking about the engine dying. And then it happened... We were 300 ft from the fuel dock and the engine shut down. We were under the US-1 bridge, and could see where we needed to go, but the minimal current of Turkey Creek was taking us in the wrong direction. Fortunately, not five minutes later a center console boat came in behind us and offered to give us a tow.

Rule #3: "So, what is the third rule I broke," you ask? I failed to take down the USPS Ensign after running out of gas.

SEO Article Continued:

Our annual Flare Up and Eau Gallie Boata Ramp Cleanup is this Saturday, 1 June. We will also be performing Vessel Safety Checks if you bring your boat.

Our Junior Basic Boating Classes are coming up in mid-June and mid-July. Over the course of three mornings, children and young adults are taught the basics to safely operate a boat in the State of Florida. This also qualifies them for a Florida State Safe Boating Card, which they will have to get eventually if they ever want to operate a boat in Florida. The Satellite Beach Recreational Department is handling class sign-ups, so please contact them if you, or someone you know, is interested.

Recently, the Eau Gallie Yacht Club has reached out to us. They are interested in making available Vessel Safety Checks for their boat owners. We have set aside 29 June, and their dock master is scheduling appointments. Now is the perfect time to get your boat inspected. As we are building our cadre of inspectors, please let me know what dates/times work for you, and we will find a time to make it happen.

Lastly, Gail and I are working to put together a day on-the-water to test some of your boating skills. I will be organizing another Dragon Point Navigation Challenge, and Gail will be spearheading a Man-Over-Board (MOB) drill. Have you ever tried navigating with just your speed and compass? Have you ever tried to pluck a dressed pumpkin from the water? It should prove to be a fun filled day. We are tentatively scheduling this event for late August or early September. A lot more information on both activities will be forthcoming.

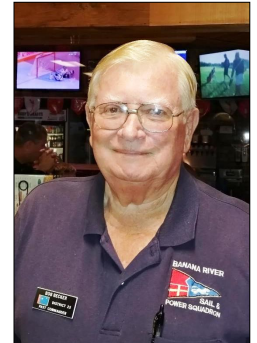

STOP!! Do NOT Put them Back in the Ocean please!



The FWC has received reports of 3 live stranded Sea Turtles in our area! Unfortunately... they were put back into the Ocean by beach goers before FWC was notified. Beached Sea Turtles are in need of Medical Attention ASAP!! So please Do NOT put them back into the Ocean, & you should report it to FWC at 888-404-3922.

If a marine animal ends up stranded on a beach, there's usually a reason for it. There's a good chance they're sick or injured, and they're too physically exhausted to save themselves. Putting them back in the water usually just means they'll end up washing up a bit further down the beach, or they'll get attacked by a predator in their weakened state. It's always best to get them checked out. In some cases, they may just be exhausted and dehydrated and can be safely released after a day or two of TLC. In other cases, they may need higher-level medical intervention. This goes for the dolphins and small whales which occasionally wash up here as well.

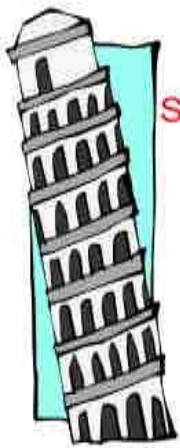

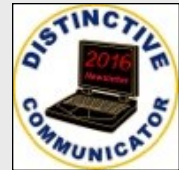
