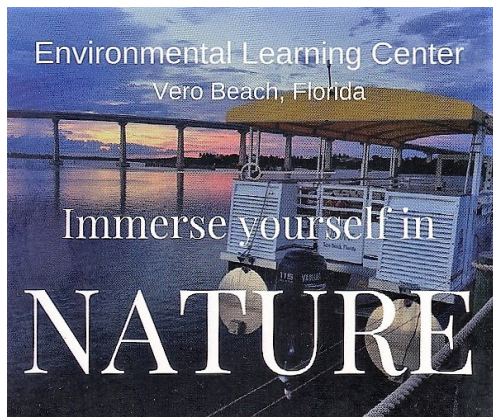

USPS STRATEGIC TRANSITION PLAN

The USPS Governing Board will meet in Louisville, KY on September 8 and during that meeting act on the Planning Committee's proposed Strategic Transition Plan endorsed by the National Board of Directors. Here are some of the highlights I see in what is proposed for the future of USPS/ABClub.



There are Three Strategies:

I with 3 Initiatives: Establish an operational structure that ensures survivability by simplifying squadron, district, and national organizational structure.

Drop general meetings (hold only an Annual meeting). Operate in reduced simplified capacity.

Make any regular gatherings fun and informative .

Eliminate ranks, grades as descriptors (create an "almost no-titles allowed" policy).

Eliminate uniforms (encourage proper casual attire).

Reduce bridge positions to four—President, VP, Sec/Tres, and Ed Coordinator.

Develop a National help/chat line to help members of squadrons who have questions.

Eliminate districts and replace with 3 facilitators who mirror National help/chat line.

Squadrons should adopt a softer name, America's Boating Club of South Brevard (done that).

Squadrons should concentrate their manpower on activities that fit member's desires.

Encourage squadrons to adopt mostly electronic means of communication (done that).

II Assess Fiscal Management (mostly at National level)

Deals with expense reimbursements, assessment of assets, operational budget, one single dues regime throughout organization, evaluate role of Endowment Funds, fund technology improvement.

III. Reflect age, gender, cultural, and demographic changes in watercraft community

Emphasize on-water training, seminars and online course access.

Develop comprehensive recruitment outreach program.

Relax uniform protocol.

Improve technology.

Establish partnerships with other organizations to reach a larger audience.

Encourage family friendly and youth activities.

It then says, "Don't fear the 'New' America's Boat Club. It is not radical overnight change of focus.

I would say the Governing Board has its hands full!! Your input is WELCOME.

CANAVERAL LOCK CLOSED | Dec to 30 March



The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers announced plans last week to conduct needed repairs and maintenance on the Canaveral Lock.

According to the Corps, the work is necessary to repair aging and damaged infrastructure in addition to improving public and vessel safety.

The Lock will be closed and dewatered from Dec. 1, 2019, through March 30, 2020. The public can provide comment on the Lock's planned closure until Thursday, Aug. 1.

During the maintenance closure – the first in 10 years – the lock chamber will be dewatered allowing crews to perform inspections, replace corroded steel structure, paint, install new gate seals and repair manatee protection system components.

During the closure, barges, floating cranes and divers will be working in the lock entrance, requiring vessel operators in the area to use minimal speed and caution for safety.

Located between the Port's West Turning Basin and the Banana River, Canaveral Lock was built in 1965 by the Army Corps of Engineers to provide vessels with a safe passage from the river to Port Canaveral and the Atlantic Ocean.

Operated by the Army Corps of Engineers, the lock reduces tidal current velocities in Canaveral Harbor, prevents entry of hurricane tides into the river and prevents saltwater intrusion.

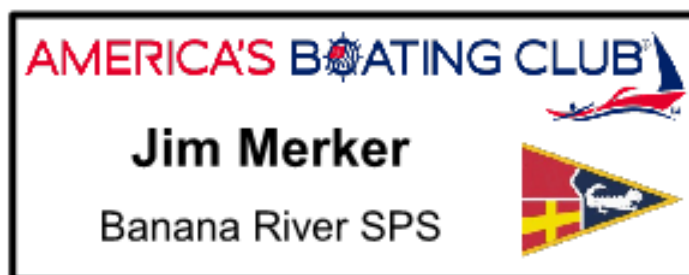

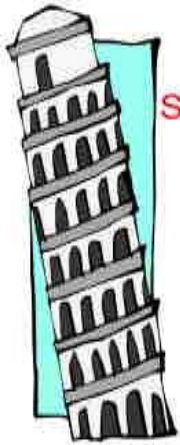

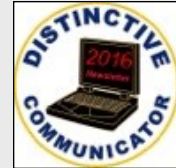
