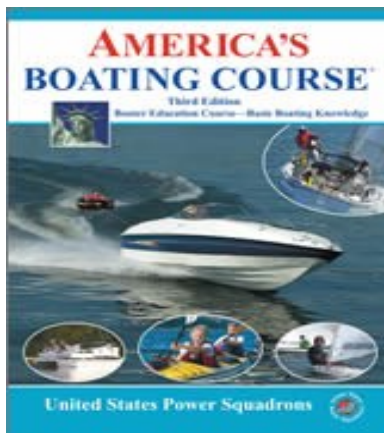

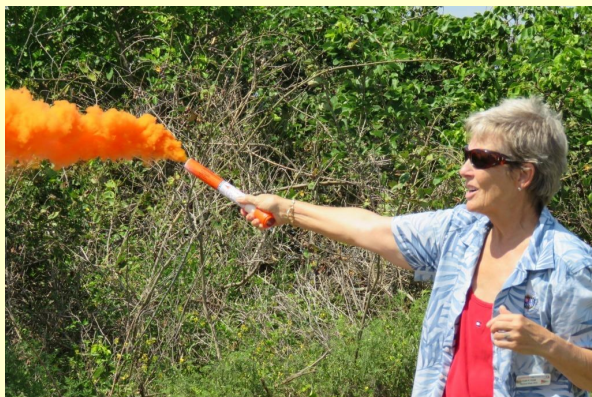

- National will focus on online educational opportunities.
- Establish a single dues regime throughout the organization

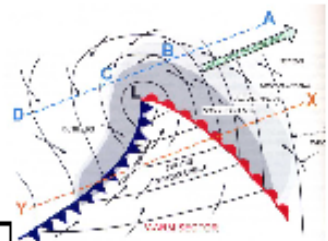

## “MUCK REMOVAL” IN THE GRAND CANAL

According to an article by Jim Waymer in *Florida Today*, August 10, 2019, a \$26.4 million project will deliver deeper and cleaner canals by November 2022 and a replanted and completed muck management area by February 2023.

Workers are clearing a temporary storage area in South Patrick Shores, just south of the Pineda Causeway, for storage of the soon-to-be-dredged organic muck from the bottom of the Grand Canal and surrounding canals. It is estimated that 26,611 dump trucks will be utilized. Muck is formed from rotten algae, grass clippings, and stormwater runoff containing silt and clays.

Gator Dredging of Clearwater is expected to start the project October 1, removing 479,000 cubic yards of muck from the Grand Canal, three entrance canals, and 16 residential finger canals. State and Federal laws will shut down dredging periodically to accommodate manatees, when one is seen near the dredge and during the winter months when seacows congregate in the canals to keep warm. They also will not dredge on weekends to avoid disrupting boating. (Ernst Hofmann has been assured that the dredging will not disrupt the Christmas Boat Parade in the Grand Canal.)

The project involves removing thousands of pounds of nitrogen and phosphorus laden muck which fuels toxic algae blooms in the Banana River Lagoon. It is the most complicated dredging project to date in the Brevard County \$486 million Indian River Lagoon cleanup plan. The dredging will take place among densely populated residential canals, and the trucks must load muck and haul it away along a heavily trafficked causeway

This is a great opportunity for photographers and nature lovers. The Park is filled with vast numbers of plants and animals, including birds, butterflies, alligators and Florida cracker horses.

At the park, you can walk more than 3.5 miles of crushed gravel trails and boardwalks, experience the lush landscape from viewing platforms, and learn about the habitat. There is a \$5/vehicle entry fee.

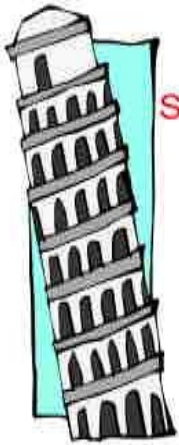

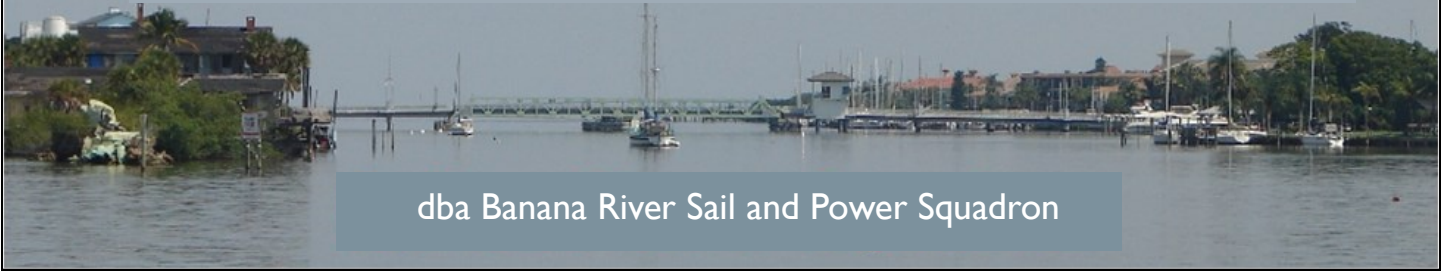

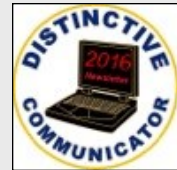
