“Tall Ship Peking”
Video presented by Ernst Hofmann

Peking was launched in 1911 at Hamburg, Germany by the Blohm & Voss shipyard. She was owned by the F. Laeisz Company of that port, who used her to carry fuel and manufactured goods to the West Coast of South America, around Cape Horn, and return to European ports with nitrate mined in northern Chile. With her four-masted barque rig, steel hull and masts, and mid-ship bridge deck, Peking represents the final generation of sailing ships built for world trade.

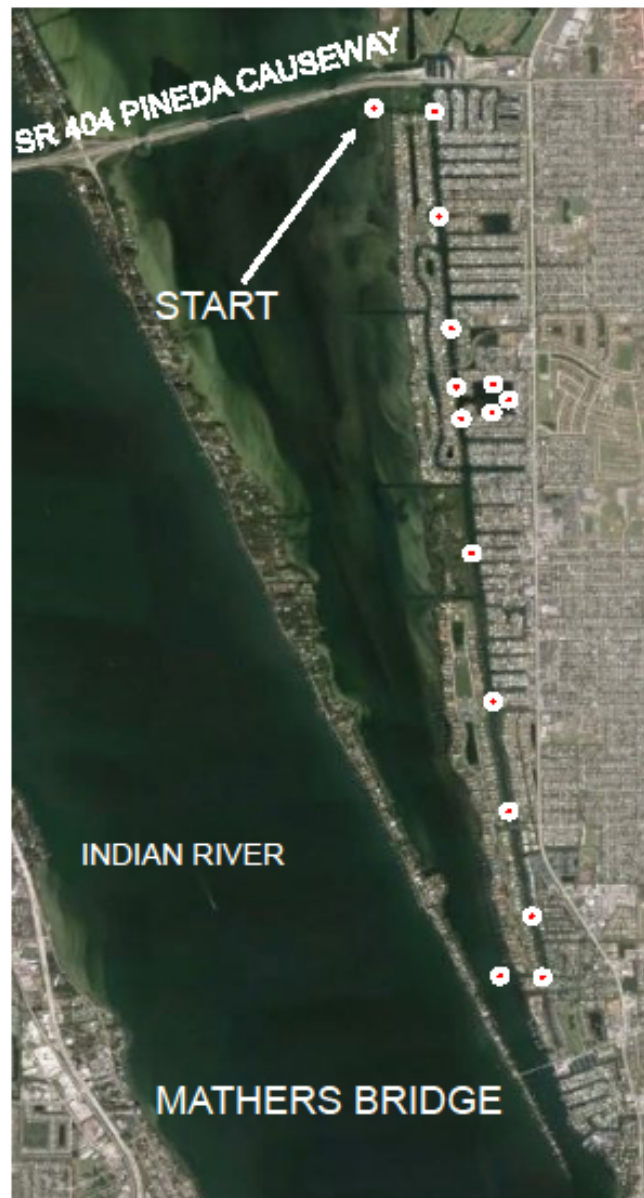

Boats will disband once in the Banana River just north of the Mathers Bridge

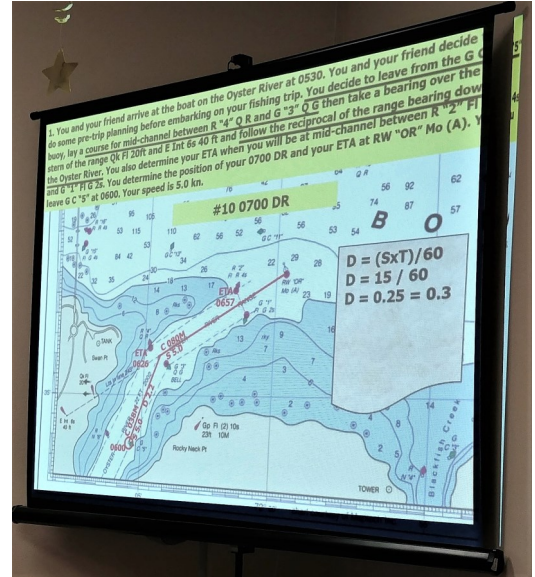

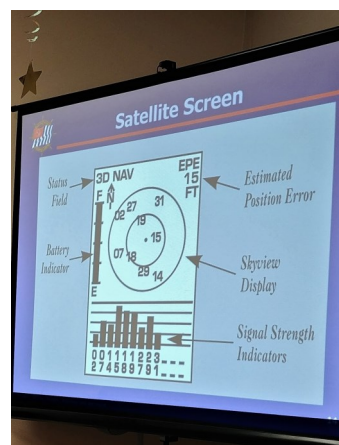

**WEEK 5 OF MARINE NAVIGATION
PLOTting A COURSE AND USE OF GPS**

MORE ON GROUNDINGS AND EXTRICATION (Applies mainly to Sail boats)

Sooner than later, it happens in our shallow inland waters - the helmsman suffered from lack of attention or excessive distraction, and you feel that ominous bump and the speed indicator goes to zero. The first line of attack is to use max power forward and reverse while the skipper shouts "all rail meat to the low side" and then, engine full forward and reverse, if still stuck, follows with "all rail meat to the high side" trying to rock the boat and break the suction of our muddy bottom. If that fails, there are four (no, better make that three) options:



KEDGING OFF – most popular and recommended method; taught in ABC3. A recent incident was described in the October issue of the Dragon Tales, although in a much more benign form than recommended in this piece.

If it so happens that if there is no dingy, the skipper orders the offending helmsman over the side (of course everyone is wearing PFDs) and instructs him/her to walk out the anchor, chain, and rode. Have one crew keep an eye on the ex-helmsman and point continuously. Tell the ex-helmsman not to come back until the rode is taught or the nostrils are under water, whichever occurs first. Step on the anchor to ascertain that it is set. Then winch-in the rode and chances

are good you are free. Oh yes, with all the excitement don't forget to collect the ex-helmsman.

INDUCING HEELING: Take a long line from the towing boat, attach it to the main halyard (after detaching it from the mainsail head) and the towing boat starts to pull. Depending on the direction of the wind, current, the topography of the bottom and your heading, you must think out the best direction for the towing vessel. Shut off the engine, because after a certain degree of heel is exceeded, you may be starving the oil pump.

BRUTE FORCE—TWO TOWBOATS: One pulling and one flushing. While on a ICW run in 2004 from Titusville to Daytona on the caravel Niña (not the 1492 version but the replica) we slowed down for a U-turn to time our arrival with the scheduled opening of the Coronado Bridge in New Smyrna. We were just standing there and enjoying the trip when all of a sudden we felt the urge of having to walk forward - it was the momentum associated with grounding because we had drifted towards the edge. After trying the usual forward/reverse sequence the skipper called for a towboat for the Niña (LOA 93.6 ft; Beam 17.3 ft; Draft 7 ft) because her well rounded bottom was solidly on the bottom.



Kedging off was not an option because her anchor was too heavy for the on-board wooden rowboat. Boat US arrived and tried the first approach of pulling us back into the channel – no luck. Next, using two lines off the starboard bow tried to pull and flush the sand/mud applying full power – still no luck.

A second Boat US was called into action which, after considerable maneuvering and more flushing freed her. Once we reached the intersection of the ICW and the



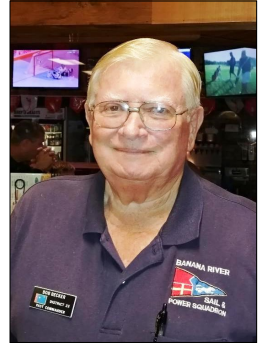
channel to the Ponce de Leon inlet we had to wait for the rising tide to be able to clear a shoal. Every passing boat was contacted by VHF to give us a depth reading. A couple of hours later we were on our way to Daytona.

DO NOT EVEN THINK ABOUT DOING THIS LAST OPTION: Taking the documents and anything of value and abandoning ship, hoping that you will not be tracked down by the authorities and presented with a salvage and removal invoice. Sadly, we see this option used in our county rather frequently after hurricanes and heavy weather.

Talk to your boating friends about our club, what we do, and what it can do for them. No, we are not a yacht club, and as such the dues are a lot, and I mean a lot less than a yacht club. If you do not have a boat, but have a love for the water, the Satellite Beach Police Department is always looking for new volunteers to man the city's police boat patrolling the canals within Satellite Beach. 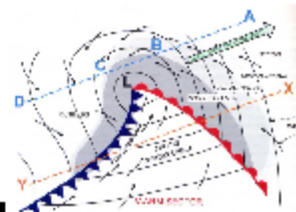

John Pechar received the Most Loyal Waterbearer Award as he continues to provide bottled water for all our Squadron activities no matter the weather!

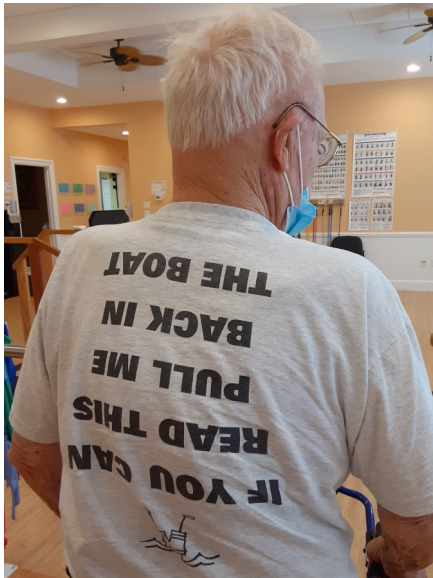

2	Christopher Columbus		B	Spain	Explorer & Conquistador. Almost discovered the Pacific Ocean. Along with his brothers, overthrew the Inca leader Atahualpa and conquered Peru, eventually establishing Lima.
3	Amerigo Vespucci		C	England	In 1969 became the first man to ever sail single-handed and non-stop around the world and in 2006, became the oldest yachtsman to complete a world solo voyage.

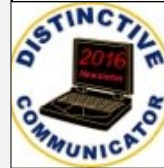
